REFLECTION

God will provide (Matthew 6: 28-34)

JMW Turner was one of the world's greatest painters. Using mainly watercolours, he purposely caused the paint colours to run into each other. This was all part of the plan – part of the creative process. It was only at the end, with a few crisp, confident strokes that Turner gave meaning and definition. This was his genius, not an accident.

And seeing Turner's unfinished work is much like how our world is at the moment: blurred at the edges, with no sense of where we are headed in this COVID - stricken world. It has little focus and even less meaning. Or so it seems.

Does this sound familiar? During this season of Lent, we contemplate the various strokes of preparation laid down by God: The Old Testament prophecies, the birth of Jesus in a stable in a small town in a far-off place. Then the teaching and preaching of Jesus, the miracles He performed, the gathering of the disciples. Culminating in the entry into Jerusalem – on a donkey colt.

The turning of opinion, conspiracy, trial, betrayal and ultimate death on the cross. Imagine how His disciples felt. The colours were beginning to flow into each other. Meaning and definition were becoming blurred. All seemed hopeless, senseless, unplanned. But then we see the final, masterly strokes of the brush; the resurrection, Jesus' ascendency to heaven, the formation and spread of the Christian church. All was clear, all was complete.

Where God is concerned, nothing is unplanned, nothing is meaningless. It may just be that we cannot see it yet. At times like this – in Lent and in the pandemic - we must leave everything in God's hands. And be content to watch the colours ebb and flow. And, when the time is right - in God's time, not ours – see His finger, creative still, trace out, in lines of love, the purpose He had in mind from the beginning.

LAST MONTH'S ANSWERS: "Brief Encounter"
